Thankfully there is no seven-year-itch for the wonderful Jarrad Tate and the very generous Tate Family Foundation who join us again for IN THE DOGHOUSE!

On Sunday 1 December, Jarrad will be joining a number of other Perthonalities and Dogs' Refuge Home volunteers to spend four hours locked in the 'pound with a hound'! This annual fundraiser is vital in helping us raise funds for the coming year.

Foundation have pledged to match the first \$25,000 donated to our In the Doghouse appeal. With your kind donation, we are aiming to raise at least \$50,000 to help support more

than 1200 lost and unwanted dogs who find themselves in our care each year.

## Why go in the Doghouse?

We've had another busy year as you will see in 'Our Pawesome Year' inside. Just over 1200



adoptions during 2018-19 and we're on track for more than 500 adoptions by early November.

Since July we've seen a spate of dogs arriving in poor physical condition. Read inside about poor Shar Pei X Shirley who arrived in in early August with her skin red raw, covered in scabs and weeping wounds. She's been on a shopping list of treatments plus lots of TLC from her foster carer and is greatly improved.

We've also got poor 12 month old pup Edwardo, who had sustained an injury that has caused a femoral neck fracture in his hip. At first we thought he would need an amputation, but 'luckily' he is able to have surgery that should offer him pain-free mobility. Again, this will only be possible through 6-8 weeks foster care post-



Then there's little Fisk. A gorgeous 7-year-old male Papillion X who was abandoned at a pound with flea dermatitis and a potentially life-threatening perineal hernia. A fundraising appeal has helped us raise over \$3500



toward his surgery and he is on the road to recovery.

These are just a few of the cases of neglect we have seen come in. But with your support we can make sure that every dog receives the best possible care until we can find them a new forever home. We think every dog deserves a second chance and seeing dogs heal and go on to live wonderful lives is what it's all about.

As always, the second half of the year is a busy one with events and this year has been no exception. Our quiz night in July was epic and lived up to expectations – the new venue at the Claremont Showgrounds was a huge success and again we had a record result.

Led for the 10th year by the amazing Lee-Anne Ashley, we raised \$38,000 and were supported by hundreds of businesses and our outstanding volunteers. It is always a huge amount of work, but everyone who attended agreed it was worth it and we even witnessed our first ever wedding proposal!

Long termer Mikey was in attendance and won everyone's heart. No one could believe he hadn't been adopted and the story of the year (decade) involves him and is included in this newsletter – get your tissues ready!

Special thanks to WA artist **Helen Norton** for supporting us for the 10th year in a row. Her contributions to our Home have raised more than \$65,000. We were pleased to make her a very worthy Life Member at this year's event.

Nelson Woss always makes a statement with his donation and this year was no different. He showed us a sneak peak of his fabulous new production about the life of KOKO (star of Red Dog) and auctioned an exclusive preview that raised \$3500.



Our **Home Open** on 19-20 October to celebrate our 84th birthday was a massive amount of work and raised a record amount - over \$25k! Again, thanks to Lee-Anne for driving this and to all the volunteers who gave up countless hours sorting jumble, potting plants, baking cakes and so much more. And so we enter the buildup to our final fundraising event for the year – **In the Doghouse** and Santa Paws on Sunday 1st December.

Once again **Jarrad Tate** is going into the kennel with our dogs and **Tate Family Foundation** are matching donations up to \$25K – legends! Pregnant mums especially need a loving home environment as do dogs who have undergone extensive medical treatment. We are indebted to our selfless foster carers who are there for us and our dogs. Special mention must go to May and Keith who have looked after more mums and pups than anyone and just when we think they won't look after another, they step up and do just that.

Ensuring our Home runs smoothly is no mean feat. It takes an army of passionate dog lovers. We welcome all new additions and want to thank Tanya Pavez and her team from **Magnetic People** for becoming a key contributor over the last six months. Tanya is providing fabulous pro bono



HR/IR advice and support to ensure we have a great workplace for our staff.

I also want to thank and acknowledge our new audit partner, Lorenzo Stella and his team at **Grant Thornton**, who are also providing their services free of charge.

Our General Manager, Kristi Treadgold, has like all GMs, had a 'baptism by fire' with her first year almost complete. Special thanks to Kristi for all your hard work, particularly all the great work with our policies and processes and for leading our Dog Welfare Committee which is seeing increasingly good outcomes for our dogs.

In March 2016 a beautiful Mastiff called Mikey arrived at our Home. He was larger than life and everyone fell in love with him instantly. Unfortunately, due to his size he wasn't quickly adopted and over the months he became reactive to other dogs in our kennels which further reduced his adoptability.

Mikey's love for people grew, but so did his separation anxiety and although he was adopted twice, he was sadly returned. His was featured in our calendar, Christmas cards, on TV and in the newspaper over the years but never managed to find his pawfect family.

In 2018, two incredible volunteers, Tom and Claire, decided to foster him. They worked FIFO, but every second week came in and collected our special boy. Mikey was the happiest dog in Perth one week and the saddest the other as he waited for them to return. He even met Tom's parents when they visited from England and quickly bonded with them too.

We tried everything to find him a home and volunteer Dani McKenna spent many months helping with his dog socialisation which improved greatly. But when Tom and Claire told us they had to relocate to Singapore our hearts sank – how would Mikey cope without his weeks away from kennel? So we had another big

push to find him a home but without luck.

We could not believe our ears when Tom announced that he and Claire would adopt Mikey and take him to the UK to live with their parents. We seriously worried about how he could possibly make the journey, now aged 8 years, and how he would adjust to a new life, living with 2 other dogs, lots of horses and peacocks and coping with the cold English weather?

Well Mikey's story has a VERY happy ending. Somehow our boy amazed us with his



### 566 saved from Pounds

We visit pounds across the metro area. Our key partners are Wanneroo (119 dogs), Gosnells (105 dogs) and Armadale (84 dogs) with another 91 dogs coming from Bayswater, Canning and Kalamunda.

## **197 Regional Dogs**

Special thanks to the nine **SAFE** Regional rescues who we worked with to bring 126 dogs to Perth in the last year. This included 94 dogs

from Broome. On our trips we also collected 57 dogs from Geraldton.

## **405 Foster Dogs**

Over 400 dogs and puppies spent time in the loving homes of 225 foster carers during the past year. Special thanks to long term foster carers May and Keith Johnson who opened their home to 13 dogs and pups. We can't thank all our foster carers enough for opening their homes and hearts until these dogs find their new homes.



# Healing neglect with TLC

A very special little girl was surrendered to us in August called Shirley. Her skin was red raw, she had lots of hair loss, many open wounds. scabs, scars and even a piece missing from her ear. It was a distressing sight to see, but her lovely personality shone through with a wagging tail and a cuddle for everyone.

Shirley has a chronic allergic condition which had gotten beyond her owners. They freely surrendered her saying they thought she was worth saving and hoped she would go to a good home. We think she's worth saving too! Aged just two years she has such a sweet, gentle nature and plenty of love left to give.

The great team at Subi Vet helped with immediate pain relief and medication. She also required entropion surgery on one eye and has been on an extensive treatment to heal her many wounds.

Fortunately, we found an amazing foster carer, Ellie, who took her in and has been an angel by her side ever since. Whilst Shirlev's skin is far from perfect, she has improved immeasurably and even features on the front of our

2020 Calendar. She has made loads of new canine and people friends and is enjoying a new life being indoors.

Ellie and her family could not have cared for Shirley any better, we are so lucky that they are part of our foster family. All our foster carer's do such an amazing job in helping to heal pooches like Shirley and we can't thank them all enough.





# He's part of the fur-niture!

During September we were delighted to celebrate Lawrence's 30th year of service at our Home. Lawrence has been our maintenance man for 30 years and our onsite caretaker.

Lawrence started at the Dogs' Refuge Home in 1989. We asked why wanted to work here, he replied with his usual wit, "I needed a job!". But we know that it was much more than that, and he followed up by saving "what better job is there than working with canines?".

When Lawrence started with us, he had five dogs of his own, so he was definitely a true dog lover and has proved this many, many times over the years.

One of Lawrence's fondest memories was a dog named Mitch. Mitch came to us from the side of the Mitchell Freeway where she had just given birth to a litter of pups. A council worker spotted her and brought her in. Mitch was re-homed but managed to find her way back to Lemnos Street, where she decided she wanted to stay and live out her life. As Mitch got older, she found it more difficult to get in and out of her bed, so

Lawrence built her a custom ramp - just one of the many caring things he has done for our dogs.

Lawrence, together with a number of volunteers, have had their work cut out for them over the years maintaining kennels that were built in the 1960s and 70s. Lawrence has also been our 'cemetery man' and has buried several hundred dogs and cats on our grounds. He is always complimented for his kindness during a sad time for owners.

Perhaps his greatest highlight was meeting his wife Leanne at the Home when she was a kennel hand. They have now been married for 17 years.

Lawrence says he's most proud for "Still being here"! We're glad you're still here too Lawrence and for all your loving care and service to the dogs.


