#### Why give this year?

But of course, there are many reasons to give. The reason we do what we do is to save healthy dogs and pups from needless euthanasia. We want to give every dog a second chance at a happy life and we want people to experience the iov of responsible dog ownership.

In the last financial year we helped unite over 1400 dogs with thousands of new owners. From 8-week-old puppies to 16-year-old 'Lady', who has gone on to live the best months of her life with a special couple who are committed to adopting senior dogs.

Despite COVID-19 and all its restrictions and confusions, we kept our motors running and made more trips 'up north' and 'down south'



than ever before. Since January we've collected 220 dogs and pups from Geraldton and 39 from Bunbury. Big thanks to our amazing volunteers who give up their time to make rescue missions and to our anon donor whose gift of a new Hyundai iLoad means we now have two vans on the road.

## President's Message

As we start the celebrations for our 85th year I want to acknowledge and thank the amazing community that has allowed our operations to survive and thrive and help give well over 60,000 dogs a second chance.

Our official celebrations started on 16th October with a special morning tea, where we reflected on our past, acknowledged how far we have come and began to get excited about what the future might hold.

A huge part of our future focus is completing our master rebuilding project, which commenced in 2011 with our new Quarantine Block. Over the last nine years we have completed two quarantine blocks, our new Adoption and Education Centre, a new caretaker cottage, three new kennel blocks and have recently turned sod for our fourth new kennel. It feels like it has taken forever to save the money to undertake each new part of the journey as we fundraise each year just to cover our day-today operational expenses.

Thanks to Dave Delahunty from EHDO Architects, we now have the final stages of our Masterplan on paper and we can't wait to share it with anyone who is interested in hearing more and maybe even contributing to our capital campaign. It is the sincere goal of the Board to see this project completed by 2025 - in time to celebrate 90 years of dog rescue in WA.

As we go to print, the next kennel is underway thanks to a generous bequest from Sonia Guinan from Mayday Dog Rescue. 'Honey's Haven' will be dedicated to Sonia and her first rescue pooch Honey. We will always remember her lifelong service to dog rescue and hope this new block will be open early in

Even though it was a bit quieter than past years, we were able to raise \$26,500 - so big thanks to everyone who came.

Established in 1935, thanks to an amazing animal welfare pioneer, Constance Horrocks and a committee of likeminded supporters, the Home has gone on to re-homed well over 60,000 dogs.

The Home has endured over this time being entirely self-funded until 2012, when we received a small, ongoing annual grant from

government towards vet costs. We are incredibly grateful and would not still be here without the support of dog-loving donors and supporters across the community. Thank you to everyone who has ever made a donation, volunteered their time or left a gift in their Will.

café, greening of the landscape and expansion of our pet cemetery


with memorial walls.

Dogs Returned: The Home accepts 'returns' of adopted dogs unconditionally regardless of when they were adopted. Sometimes the fit is just not right, but often circumstances within the household change and dogs are surrendered back into our care.



## 664 saved from Pounds

We visit pounds across the metro area. Our key partners are Wanneroo (68 dogs), Gosnells (77 dogs) and Armadale (72 dogs) with another 108 dogs coming from Bayswater, Canning, Kalamunda and South Perth. Counted in these numbers are all dogs transferred into our care from Shire pounds around the State.

#### **Regional Dogs**

A record year with more and more dogs arriving from regional communities. Special thanks to the seven SAFE regional rescues who transferred 89 dogs into our care. Despite travel restrictions for part of the year, 84 dogs arrived from Broome while we collected over 200 dogs from Geraldton – four times the number collected in 2018/19.

A spike in the number of dogs entering our care and people working from home during COVID-19 saw a record 473 dogs (including 204 puppies) spend time with one of **260 foster carers** during the past year. We can't thank all our foster carers enough for their compassion and dedication in providing a home-away-from-home for our dogs.

## Rierry is travelling on... to a better life

Kierry was a camp dog who found herself homeless and off to the big smoke in May. At the age of eight years, malnourished and with some medical concerns, she was in dire need of some TLC.

Kierry found the kennels and the cold a bit a bit too stressful, so a foster carer was found to let her build up her strength and confidence in a warm home.

Meanwhile out in Leonora, schoolteacher Reggie was searching for a rescue dog to call her own. With COVID-19 travel restrictions eased, Reggie headed to Perth for the July school holidays. Seeing Kierry still on our website and knowing how hard it can be for larger,

senior dogs to find new homes, Reggie was keen to meet her and see if they clicked!

Thankfully it was a pawfect match, so Reggie adopted Kierry and made arrangements to come back and collect her once her medical tests had been completed. In mid-July, Kierry headed back to the red dirt of her new Goldfields home.

In just over four months the pair have formed a great bond and Kierry is enjoying being a pampered pooch by her new mamma. Reggie loves outback travel and photography so Kierry is enjoying exploring new terrain

in their weekend adventures to places like Malcolm Dam, Horrans Lake and The Breakaways.



### Regional Rescue - missions of love

And while we're talking about "travelling on", we've been doing a lot of our own over the last 12 months, but especially in recent months. We've brought in a record number of dogs from regional and rural WA, travelling to Carnarvon, Kalgoorlie, Bunbury, Geraldton and small stops in between.



Our regional rescue is only possible through the dedication of our volunteer drivers, each who have done multiple trips north and south in the last few months. In early September, our vans and vollies set a record pace – 4,656km, 52 hours of driving and 48 dogs and puppies rescued!

## Passion for pooches drives our 'Seniors'

It takes a village to care for 'our village' and Henry is just one of our amazing volunteers who digs in and helps out.

When Henry and his wife lost their beloved dog Azay several years ago, Henry decided he'd come and walk dogs at the Home. These days Henry has hung up his lead and taken up a spade and is often seen tending to the gardening and graves in our pet memorial cemetery. The cemetery was opened in 1937 and was the first of its kind known anywhere in Australia.

In preparation for our 85th celebrations, Board Member and avid historian Marsha, decided to rally the troops for some 'busy-bees' in early October. Joining her were Henry and many of our regular volunteers, their friends and some students from St Catherine's College UWA.

All the graves were weeded and many adorned with new silk flowers providing a resplendent backdrop to our special morning tea and Home Open events. Great love, care and respect is shown for all the beloved pooches laid to rest on our grounds and we are very grateful to everyone who donated their time and tools to this special project.

And to Henry and so many other 'seniors' who give up their time week in and week out to come and do jobs - many physical and labouring jobs - around the Home. We can't thank you all enough.



### Fostering brings family joy

Wilfred, Ling and daughter Rei took their first foster home in August 2017 and three years later, Kylde has become 16th foster dog.

The Woo family believes that every dog comes to them for a reason. They have taken on dogs with complex medical needs, challenging behaviours and those in dire need of respite from long-term kennel life. Their longest foster was Joey, a Bully Terrier cross with developmental abnormality of the bone and cartilage that meant his front feet were severely deformed.

The Woo's gave three-year-old Joey a loving home for 12 months until a sudden brain tumor took his life in July 2019.

Ling said that while they have been tempted many times to adopt, as a family they have decided that fostering will allow them to help as many dogs as they can. "It's very meaningful, but of course it's hard to say goodbye," she said. "We find the joy of seeing a dog find a forever home is far greater than the sadness of losing them."

That was the case with longtermer Johnson, an 18 month
old black Am Staffy cross
who in February 2019 and
went into the family's
care in October. Ling
said they cried tears
of joy when Johnson
was finally adopted
May. "We were so
pleased he had his
own family at last."

Their most recent foster is 5-year-old Rhodesian Ridgeback X Klyde. Poor Klyde has been let down in two prior homes and has developed a lameness that will see him require support and pain management from caring owners for the rest of his life. Ling says Klyde is an angel and possibly the most obedient of all the dogs they have fostered. He loves to follow them around but also likes his own space to relax – especially out in the sun.

Klyde is currently looking for his forever home. He is not great around other dogs and is fearful of traffic, but Ling says like all their foster dogs they make adjustments to manage his needs. "We just walk dogs like Klyde at quiet times in the night or morning and away from busy areas," she said. "We work around their needs and try to help them while they are in our care."
