



It is truly an honour to have accepted the position of General Manager at the Dogs' Refuge Home. When I first joined the Refuge in early 2021 in the role of Digital Marketing Coordinator, the Home immediately felt like my home.

To be able to come in to work every day knowing you are making a difference to the lives of so many homeless and unwanted dogs is something I feel very privileged to be able to do. Over the past 18 months, I have welcomed over 60 foster dogs and puppies into my family. My partner now rolls his eyes every time the garage door goes up and he sees a new happy and hopeful face sat beside me in the passenger seat. There are no better dogs in the world than Dogs' Refuge Home dogs, and if I could have 50 in my home at once, I would! We have lost countless sofas, rugs, cushions and shoes- but it's all worth it to see them be adopted by their forever families.

My first few months in the role of General Manager have been filled with excitement, joy and of course some challenging days. Despite this, every single day I am amazed at the resilience, hard work and positive attitude of our team. Seeing the volunteers turn up day after day in wind and rain, scorching sun and everything in between never ceases to amaze me. Even when the going gets really tough, it's never as tough as our vollies, and

there's no lengths they would not go to for our dogs. To say 'thank you' never feels enough.

The staff too continue to impress me with their ability to adapt to the changing nature of dog adoption in Western Australia and across the country. These are extremely testing times. Our adoption figures have suffered but intake remains worryingly high. This constant imbalance takes its toll on our team who are the ones having to say 'no' to dogs in need simply due to a lack of kennel space. In these trying months our staff have rallied, caring for all of our new arrivals and exceeding welfare standards, finding foster homes for more dogs than ever before to get them out of kennels, and trying new initiatives to educate the public as to why rescue really is the best breed.

But it's not all doom and gloom, we have also had some real highs over the past few months. From saving dogs from horrendous conditions and sending them off to their forever homes. to opening our brand-new kennel "The Penthouse" and celebrating milestone birthdays, there's still plenty of fun in every day. We've seen long term dogs finally find families after waiting years and have witnessed countless amazing physical and behavioural transformations. We've had 'puppy fever' all year, and I am so grateful for the amazing work of Vice President Lynne Milligan who, in her volunteer role as 'puppy maestro' has rehomed more dogs this year than anyone else on the team; bravo Lynne!

Lynne, along with our President Karen Rhodes have been pillars of strength and fantastic mentors as I took on my new role. It is amazing to see the Board of a not for profit so dedicated and involved and interested in the day-to-day operations of the Home. It gives me great comfort to know that each and every Board member truly understands the work we do, and every decision is made with the dog's best interest at heart as we strive towards our vision of a community where every dog is in a safe and loving home.

While we take a moment to look back on a remarkable year it makes me very excited for what's to come in the year ahead. We continue to forge ahead with our Master Plan, turning each of our kennels into the luxury accommodation our dogs deserve. I cannot thank each of our generous benefactors enough for turning this dream into a reality. In the year ahead we will continue to spread the message of responsible dog ownership far and wide, and hope that we begin to see a reduction in the number of dogs finding themselves homeless through no fault of their own.

To everyone who has adopted, fostered, volunteered, donated and advocated for our dogs; thank you. Without you we could never do what we do and I am amazed every day at the compassion, dedication and love shown by our generous dog loving community. I hope you all have a wonderful festive season spent with loved ones, and look forward to seeing many of you in the New Year.

In last year's Annual Report, we celebrated the opening of Honey's Haven thanks to an incredibly generous legacy left by the late Sonia Guinan. This year we celebrated the opening of The Penthouse thanks to a grant from the Government which was supported by our local MP Dr Katrina Stratton and opened by our Premier Mark McGowan. Seeing our dogs in these new kennels is so rewarding and we are very grateful, but it does remind us how much more we have to do as we still have lots of old kennels that need replacing.

With the never-ending number of dogs desperately needing our help we need as much support as we can get and I am forever grateful to those who volunteer, donate, foster, remember us in their will and help us to spread the word about the work we do and the importance of the community understanding that adopting a dog is a life changing experience and literally saves lives. I've been involved with the Home for 16 years, and this is the worst I've seen it for doas in need. Every single office has a dog and some multiple dogs, but we will always do whatever we can to rescue the next one.

Many long-term residents found their forever homes these last 12 months and many happy tears have been shed as we waved them off and have since received fabulous feedback about how wonderful they are. We're hoping some of our other long-term resident find their homes very soon too.

The need for us and what we do is sadly increasing – I've never known so many dogs being abandoned and, speaking with other rescue groups it's not just us. We're all in the same boat, desperately trying to find homes for our dogs so we can fit the next ones in, thanks to the other rescues who also work tirelessly and thanks to our amazing foster carers who help us extend our kennel capacity every day.

Our partners at the pounds, especially regional do an amazing job keeping dogs safe until we have room to fit them in. Big thanks also to our volunteer drivers who do more kilometres than I can count to collect and bring these dogs to the safety of our Home.

There will be a couple of changes on our Board as our Treasurer Phil Golding and Board Member Lynda Hancy step down after many years of service and after having contributed greatly to our Mission. Phil has made a significant difference to our investment portfolio and Lynda manages our valuable donor database

and is dedicated to walking dogs twice a week plus helps at every event. Thank you to both Phil and Lynda. Thanks also to Simon Herbert from Distinctive Homes who stepped down from our Board a few months ago. Simon was a big support during our last kennel build and his building expertise and contacts were a huge help in ensuring we got exactly what our dogs needed.

For the 10th year in a row the amazing Tate Family Foundation matched donations up to \$25K for our In the Dog House fundraiser – that's a whopping \$250K over the years.

When we started looking for our next GM we decided to head hunt to ensure we got the right person with the right values and the same commitment to rescue that we all have. We met with a few impressive candidates but realised the best person for the job was already on our team. We were delighted when our very own Robyn Slater accepted our offer of General Manager. Robyn has been with us nearly two years now and understands every area of our operations, is devoted to rescue, and is committed to ensuring we work smarter not harder. She has already made a difference to how we operate and her skills in data analysing and reporting has been insightful.

What we did realise when looking externally is how well we currently do a number of things, our policies and procedures are solid, and we have some amazing staff who have been with us for many years and who are as good as you'll find in any rescue. Promoting from within has been rewarding and we're so proud of how well we currently operate. Now that's not to say we don't want to or need to improve but it was nice to reflect on how far we've come and how strong we are

Being reliant on fundraising and bequests to survive means we can't possibly justify spending money on advertising but getting the word out there about our work is critically important – that's why we are so grateful to Beau Pearson from Ch10 who visits us regularly to record his weather segment and allows us to promote some of our dogs available for adoption.

I'd like to thank each and every Board Member for their commitment and dedication to our Home and for the countless hours they spend late at night and on weekends ensuring good Governance and sustainability is always top of mind. Extra thanks to VP Lynne Milligan who is a pillar of strength and a great support either as VP, Acting President, or doing more adoptions than anyone else. To every volunteer who never let us down, give us thousands of hours week in and week out and who love and cherish our dogs as their own and to our staff for their hard work in what can be an emotional environment, thank you!

Thank you to every supporter who has also adopted, fostered or donated. I wish you and your family a safe and happy Christmas and say a heartfelt thanks for enabling us to do what we do.

Another great year with more and more dogs arriving from regional communities. The 395 dogs saved includes dogs entering our care from regional pounds and other rescue groups. With intake requests at an all time, we make great efforts to travel to regional areas and save at risk dogs. This financial year 260 dogs arrived from Geraldton, 33 dogs arrived from Broome, 37 dogs from Kalgoorlie and 36 dogs from Bunbury.

FOSTERING STATS





Foster Homes

Another huge year for our foster team with 466 dogs (including 201 puppies) spending time with one of 305 foster carers during the past year. We can't thank all our foster carers enough for their compassion and dedication in providing a home-away-from-home for our dogs. Another thanks to our amazing Foster Coordinator, Kylie Markoff for her dedicated work.

IN MEMORIAM

We work tirelessly to provide the best outcome for all dogs that enter our care. However, on the advice from our vet behaviourists and our trainers we must accept that some dogs just cannot safely be rehomed in the Community. In 2021/22 fifteen dogs (0.9% of our dogs) were humanely put to sleep on behavioural grounds. Each dog was treated with love and kindness during their passing.

Financial Summary

Revenue from kennel operations reflected the high number of dogs adopted out and a return of boarding kennel activity. Kennel costs also reflect adoption activity and increases in prices of goods and services.

Our employee costs included the increase in the national wage in July 2021 and the appointment of previously vacant positions.

The level of public support and our fund raising programs can be seen in donations received. We continue to enjoy great support for our activities from the community. We were fortunate to receive a number of substantial bequests during the year.

The State Government grant allowed us to undertake construction of the new kennel block which was partly completed at year end.

We continue to favour capital preservation in our investment program but our portfolio was not immune from adverse market conditions in the second half of the year. Higher interest rates will drive our returns higher in 2022/23.

Unfortunately, one poor sweet puppy, Winter, did not make it.

As we enter the hot summer months once again, please, please if you have an unvaccinated dog at home **VACCINATE THEM NOW!** This virus does not pose a significant health risk to vaccinated dogs but can be fatal in up to 91% of untreated cases with unvaccinated dogs. Huge thanks to everyone who donated to our fundraiser to help us cover the \$30,000 vet bills, allowing us to save these angels.

We knew Harley would need a specific home, there was a chance that down the line she would require further treatment. That's when we met her perfect new owners who fell in love with her instantly, Lauryn says:

"We adopted Harley (otherwise known as Pretty Girl) almost 12 months ago. She has had some real health troubles and needed a surgery at 8 months old which left her needing to be as still as possible for 6 weeks!

Thankfully The Dogs' Refuge Home helped us financially and we were able to give Harley the surgery she needed!

She is the biggest cuddle bug and loves to play around with her best

friend Poppy. Her Grandma's and Grandad's spoil her rotten as well as her Mum and Dad! She already has Christmas presents under the tree.

She loves camping and going on adventures and is just the happiest little/big puppy ever! I think the pictures do more justice then words ever could."

Harley has had a tumultuous 12 months of life so far, from overcoming sepsis, going from a foster home to a forever home and then major surgery at 8 months old. We are so thankful we could help Harley through this and to see her living her best doggy life, reminds us why we do what we do! Desex Your Pets!

This year we've had an alarming rate of hoarding cases, backyard breeding situations and unplanned litters across Perth. On 3 separate occasions we've been contacted to help rescue multiple dogs that have been living in less-than-ideal conditions and are not receiving the proper love and care that they deserve.

Back in December 2021, we received a call from our amazing friends at Husky Rescue WA. They had done phenomenal work rescuing 20 dogs from a hoarding situation in NSW. These dogs had never left a property in their entire lives, and there were over 80 dogs who had been severely neglected.

Nine of these babies then made their way to us. The three boys were the most confident and the girls took more time to warm up to new people. They were young, petite husky mixes, looking for calm and patient homes.

These pups made good progress with our dedicated team, but it was clearer they needed consistent positive reinforcement and a very patient, loving approach. We told potential adopters that it would no doubt take a long time, potentially months (maybe years), before these dogs feel truly comfortable and safe in their new environment.

In February 2022, we were asked by a member of our community who had become overwhelmed with the number of dogs at her property, to help her situation. 16 dogs Terrier

mixes were surrendered into our care. The dogs were all young- between a year and 18 months old- and had not been socialised with the great big world around them.

Many of the dogs were very timid in their current environment, like the Husky mixes these dogs were needing very specific homes with very understanding and patient owners.

More recently we had 27 mixed breed dogs surrendered into our care that had come from a back yard breeding situation where there were over 100 dogs on the property. Other rescue groups helped on this rescue mission, and we can proudly say that all 27 dogs have been successfully rehomed and are thriving in their new environments. They are welcomed into the home as loved family members, and they are slowly getting used to the outside world.

It is so important that we continue to advocate for responsible dog ownership including desexing your pets! It is shocking to us that in 2022 we are still seeing such high rates of unwanted or unplanned litters that can easily be prevented.

We haven't used these kennels for our dogs for a while now but we are landlocked so couldn't demolish these without demolishing other kennels too including old quarantine.

We are able to proceed with our next phase thanks to some generous West Australians remembering us in their wills and thanks to an incredibly generous donation from one of our long term volunteers who never ceases to astound us with her devotion to our dogs and our Home.

We're hoping to have the demolition and re-build done by the end of 2023 and then we'll prepare for the next phase. Having state of the art kennels is so important for our dogs and they all deserve the very best we can
